Greetings from Georgia and the Young Republicans!

We are happy to submit this letter and its supplementary documentation as our application for candidate membership In International federation of Liberal Youth for your review and consideration during the the 28th Extraordinary General Assembly in Andorra on December 14-17, 2006.

The Young republicans were found in July 2, 2005. However, notwithstanding little experience that we have, a lot has been done in order to create real liberal youth organization. According to the Charter of the Young Republicans, General Assembly of members obtains major ruling power; the chairman and the Administrative Board are elected by the Assembly. They are meant to control each other, perform the so called "Checks and balances" inside the youth movement and this way avoid the threat of overpowering any single person.

Hereby, our objective is to be not only liberal youth organization, but also influential liberal youth organization. We have 712 members, 18 regional branches and 12 groups of initiators at present and we plan to cover 70 % of local areas and 50% of regions of Georgia in near future. This will be the most powerful network of youth organizations in Georgia.

It should be also admitted that the greatest challenge for Republican Party of Georgia as well as Young Republicans is to spread the liberal ideas and democratic values in Georgia. Otherwise we will never gain support of Georgian citizens and we will not be able to change the development of Georgia into a positive way. In order to achieve this goal it is very important to be concentrated on young generation – bring ideas of freedom and democracy to each young person in Georgia, make them more active and responsible for their own future, as well as future of their country. This is actually what we do now. However, there is still lack of experience in carrying out and implementing of specific policy on this kind of issues. We hope that in this sphere we can learn a lot from liberal youth organizations from various countries, like those ones that are represented in IFLRY. The Young Republicans need to have intensive relationships with other youth organizations in order to receive information and knowledge in field of pursuing liberal policy. Due to this for us it is very important to collaborate with foreign liberal youth organizations, especially with IFLRY, which brings such organizations together. We hope that in nearest future we will be able to become members of IFLRY. We will try our best in order to fulfill all accession procedures successfully and achieve this goal. At present, accession in IFLRY is one of the main objectives for our organization.

Furthermore, liberalism is the concept which is permanently under the process of reformation. There appear new ideas that promote notions of freedom, tolerance


and democracy all over the world. New obstacles emerge and new solutions are found for them. Liberals should share these ideas with each other. For that reason it is so important for us to be the members of liberal family, like IFLRY. As for our role in this family, we consider that now in Georgia there are more opportunities to implement even radical liberal ideas than in many other states. We are hopeful that our application will be favorably reviewed.



The Statute of the Young Republicans



*As Adopted by the General Assembly
May 9, 2006. Tbilisi, Georgia*

Chapter I: General regulations

Article 1. Status, aims and principles.

1. Youth movement of Republican Party of Georgia (Young Republicans) is structural unit of the Republican Party and it aims to support the policy of the Republican Party.
2. YR acts according to constitution of Georgia and generally accepted principles of international law. The Republican Party of Georgia Guarantees to YR non-interference in its internal affairs and decision making.
3. All the decisions of the youth movement must correspond to the present statute.
4. The regulation of the matters not unforeseen by the present statute shall be made according to the principles of law.
5. The address of the YR is: 11 Al. Chavchavadze st, Tbilisi, Georgia.

Article 2. Type of Activities.

1. The activities of YR are determined by the Administrative Board corresponding to the political program.
2. Political program of YR is a written document, reflecting objectives of the youth movement and specific ways for their implementation according to the principles and goals of the YR.
3. The political program of the organization is confirmed by the Administrative Board and the chairman is responsible for implementation.

Article 3. Membership of the organization, rights and duties.

1. The member of the organization should be at least 18 years old, citizen of Georgia, who agrees regulations of the statute and political program of the YR.
2. New members are accepted upon the decision of the Administrative Board.
3. The rules and procedures for acceptance of new members shall be adopted by the Administrative Board.
4. A member of youth movement is not considered as a member of the Republican Party automatically.
5. The right of a member is:
 - a. to take part in movement's governing by holding active and passive electoral rights;
 - b. to apply to any structural unit of the youth movement (with complain, statement, suggestion) and receive the answer.
 - c. to present a candidate for any elective position.
 - d. to receive copies of all official documents and decisions of the Administrative Board according to the rules confirmed by Administrative Board.
 - e. to withdraw from membership by written statement.
6. The duty of the member is:
 - a. to act according to the present statute.
 - b. to take part in the election campaign of the YR or the mother party.
 - c. not to commit the action discrediting the movement.
 - d. to participate in compulsory activities, planned by the YR.
 - e. to pay membership fee in quantity and according to the rules of the payment established by the administrative board.

7. The member of the youth movement will face the following punishment for non fulfillment of his (or her) duties.
 - a. Reprimand.
 - b. Termination of membership.
 - c. Exclusion from the organization.
8. The rules and conditions for applying the punishment are determined by the Administrative Board.
10. The organization may have supporters and the relations with them are determined separately by the Administrative Board.

Chapter II: The structure of the youth movement.

Article 4. Governing bodies

1. There are the following structural bodies for governing the YR.
 - a. General Assembly
 - b. The Administrative board
 - c. The chairman
 - d. The Central Apparatus

Article 5. The General Assembly

1. General Assembly is the integral body of the movement. It is held annually by the invitation of the chairman of the YR, who is simultaneously the chairman of assembly.
2. The chairman should invite extraordinary meeting of General Assembly upon request of ½ members of Administrative Board or members of movement.
3. General Assembly takes place not earlier than 30 and not later than 40 days since the decision on holding its meeting with pre-determined agenda and is closed after discussing all issues on the agenda.
4. The delegates are called by the Administrative Board. The agenda of the General Assembly is communicated to the delegates by the chairman 20 days prior to the meeting.
5. General Assembly is eligible to take decisions if half of the delegates are present. If the necessary quorum is not present, the chairman will call another meeting of General Assembly not earlier than 10 days before and not later than 15 days late with the same agenda and General Assembly is eligible on decision making regardless of the number of delegates present.
6. The decision is made by the General Assembly according to the simple majority on all issues but changes to the statute.
7. General Assembly has the authority:
 - a. to hear and discuss report of the chairman, representatives of governing bodies, as well as and the Chamber of Inspection.
 - b. to elect the chairman of the organization from candidates presented by the chairman of the Republican Party;
 - c. upon demand of 1/3 of members of movement, to announce non-confidence in Chairman and upon the approval of 2/3 participating delegates remove the chairman. This decision should be confirmed by the National Committee of the Republican Party of Georgia, as a condition of entry into force.
 - d. to adopt the statute of the YR and make changes in it.

- e. to elect the Chamber of Inception;
 - f. to elect the Administrative Board;
 - g. to fulfill the functions foreseen by present statute;
8. The decision of General Assembly is compulsory for all members and bodies of the YR.

Article 6. Administrative Board

1. The Administrative Board is the main body of the YR, which defines its internal and external policy, controls activities of Central Apparatus and fulfills other duties;
2. The Administrative Board consists of 14 directly elected members for two years and chairman of YR.
3. The election rules are defined by the General Assembly;
4. The meeting of the Board takes place monthly, on the first Monday and is supervised by the chairman of the youth movement.
5. In case of necessity the chairman or 1/3 of the YR's members call upon extraordinary meeting of the Administrative Board. The Extraordinary meeting is held with the pre-determined agenda and is closed after discussing all issues in it. The meeting of the Administrative Board should take place not earlier than 24 hours from making such a decision.
6. The Administrative Board takes decisions if half of the members are present.
7. It is compulsory for the member of the Administrative Board to attend the meeting. Otherwise he / she will get the reprimand.
8. The Administrative Board takes decisions with the simple majority, if not otherwise determined by the statute. Each decision is sealed as a resolution.
9. The board administration has the authority:
 - a. to listen reports of the chairman and central Apparatus.
 - b. to confirm the policy program of the youth movement.
 - c. to define specific action plan.
 - d. to define procedures for membership.
 - e. upon demand of 2/3 of the members of administrative board, to announce no confidence to the Chairman.
 - e. as necessary, to create or eliminate additional structural units of the organization and define appropriate regulations.
 - f. to confirm or dismiss the chairmen of structural units of the youth movement.
 - g. to confirm or abolish the decisions of chairman or structural unit of the youth movement.
 - i. to define quantity and rule of payment for membership fee.
 - j. to confirm the budget of the organization.
 - k. to fulfill other activities foreseen by present statute.
10. The decision of the administrative board is compulsory for each member, all bodies and structural units, other than General Assembly.

Article 7. The Central Apparatus

1. The Central Apparatus is the executive body of the youth movement, which implements its duties according to the present statute, resolutions of the administrative board and chairman.
2. The Central Apparatus reports to the administrative Board and Chairman.
3. The authority, structure and activities are defined by the resolutions of the administrative Board.

Article 8. The chairman of the YR

1. The chairman is the highest official with the YR, presented by the chairman of Republican Party and elected for 2 years by the General Assembly.
2. The chairman acts according to the present statute. He / She reports to the Administrative Board and the General Assembly.
3. The authorities of the chairman are the following:
 - a. to call and supervises meeting of the Administrative Board and General Assembly;
 - b. to represent YR in the Political Council of the Republican Party and in relations with other organizations.
 - c. to signs the resolutions of the Administrative Board and other official documents;
 - d. to order a resolution for the performance of duties;
 - e. to fulfill other activities foreseen by present statute.
4. In case of non fulfillment of his / her duties by the Chairman, duties are fulfilled by the member of the Administrative Board upon the appointment by the Chairman. In case of non existence of such appointment, his / her duties are implemented by the oldest member of the Administrative Board.
5. The chairman of the organization should not be a member of any other body of the movement besides the Administrative board and General Assembly;
6. The chairman's authority is terminated in case of expiration of term of office, removal, or death. In those cases Republican Party will present a new candidate to the General Assembly within ten days.

Chapter III: Finance and Control

Article 9. Finances

1. The finances of the organization are reflected in the budget of the YR, which is asserted by the Administrative Board with simple majority of its members.
2. The finances of the movement are spent only according to the budget;
3. The rule for adoption of the budget is confirmed by the Administrative Board.
4. The administrative Board hears annual financial report and confirms it. Otherwise the Administrative Board automatically applies to the National Committee of Republican Party of Georgia to discuss the activities/ responsibility of the Chairman.
5. Organization's financial sources include:
 - a. The sums apportioned by Republican Party;
 - b. Membership fees;
 - c. All other legal donations and incomes;
6. The quantity and rule of payment of membership fees are defined by the resolution of Administrative Board;

Article 10. Chamber of Inspection

1. Chamber of Inspection controls activities of members of the YR and its structural unites to the present statute, as well as supplementary documentation.
2. The members of the Chamber of Inspection are elected by the General Assembly from its members for two years.
3. Members of Chamber of Inspection elect the chairman from its members for two years.

4. Member of Chamber of Inspection is not allowed to be the member of other organizational body except General Assembly.
5. Member of Chamber of Inspection has the authority to receive any information and documentation from any body/structural unit of the youth movement and receive it as soon as possible, to attend their meetings without any limitations.
6. Chamber of Inspection after the inception of the activities of the YR, defines and presents recommendations for different bodies/structural units.
7. Chamber of Inspection reports only to the General Assembly. In case of non fulfillment of his / her duties, member of the Chamber of Inspection can be dismissed by the general Assembly and new member should be elected for the term left in office.

Chapter IV: Temporary provisions

Article 11. Regulations for the transitional period

The administrative Board should resolved issues foreseen by articles of 3.3, 3.8, 8.7 and 10.6 of the present statute.

Chapter V: The Concluding Regulations

Article 12. Restructuring and liquidation

1. Only National Committee of the Republican party of Georgia is authorized to reorganize or liquidate the YR.
2. In case of liquidation of the YR, all its property will be transmitted to the Republican Party.

Article 13. Changes and additional rules of present statute

1. Only General Assembly is authorized to make changes in present statute, which will be enforced after the confirmation by the National Committee of the Republican Party of Georgia.
2. The member of the Administrative Board or 100 members of the YR are authorized to present the changes of the present statute.

Article 14. Enforcement

1. Present statute will come in force as confirmed by the General Assembly of YR and the National Committee of the Republican Party of Georgia.
2. Simultaneously, the statute accepted in 2005 will be considered as invalid.

Ideological Standpoint of the Young Republicans

We believe that...

- Individual liberty is the basis for society.
- Individuals know best what is best for them.
- Pluralistic democracy is the best way to organize state and ensure individual liberty of each citizen.
- State and its institutions exist to further the ends of individuals, without showing favor to those of higher social rank.
- Value of goods and services should be set by the unfettered choices of individuals, that is, of market forces.
- Liberalism is based on market economy. Free market economy based on capitalism and private property rights is the superior economic system to serve to guarantee freedom and prosperity. Value of goods and services should be set by the unfettered choices of individuals, that is, of market forces.
- Little or no government regulation of economy will lead society to prosperity.
- Law has the superior power in state. Governmental authority is legitimately exercised only in accordance with written, publicly disclosed laws adopted and enforced in accordance with established procedures.
- All citizens have equal rights regardless of sex, race, or economic status.
- Individuals have right of pertaining to conscience and lifestyle, including such issues as sexual freedom, religious freedom, cognitive freedom, and protection from government intrusion into private life.

Our vision – Georgia's future

We, the Young Republicans believe that Georgia's dignified future is directly associated with the formation of a liberal democratic state based on the rule of law, development of civil society and European integration.

All other political strategies and orientations, weather they are of the pseudo-democratic, seemingly-patriotic or even temporarily-authoritarian varieties, bring to

societies a life of quasi-statehood, illegality, poverty and perpetual conflicts. This standpoint is not blindly taken from the West, but is rather based on Georgian history and culture. In Georgian history the coming of the 'golden-age' was not associated with life in social or cultural vacuum, or searching "purely Georgian" ways of advancement, but rather with sharing the best achievements of contemporary civilizations and gaining its own dignified place within these civilizations.

Therefore, our model for Georgia's prosperity doesn't allow for any "timely" or "tactical" compromises with such fundamental liberal-democratic values as supremacy of the law, limiting the state through human rights, inviolability of ownership, free entrepreneurship, equality before the law, political pluralism, division of powers, an independent judiciary, safeguarding minority rights, and so on. Apart from that, the Republican Party knows that the well-being of individuals, and society at large, comes not from the state, but from free and fair competition guaranteed by the state.

We are the nation of strong and free individuals, freedom-loving and competitive, but also the nation, existing without its own state for more than two centuries. We haven't lost our motherland, language or belief, but we lost general characteristics of living within a state and we have never been imbued with the traditions of contemporary liberal statehood. We know what a state means to which we sacrifice our lives but we know nothing about contemporary state which affords an opportunity of standing in its service without giving a sacrifice. The Republicans don't believe that a human is born with inherent duty of showing selfless heroism for the motherland or belief. We rather believe that a human is born with its aspiration for freedom, which in itself cannot be realized without motherland, national-cultural environment and belief. Though, free choice of a free individual can mean everything, including self-sacrifice for the motherland and belief.

The Young Republicans together with Republicans Party of Georgia offers the society a political organization of social co-existence where the national identity and traditions preservation-promotion can live in tandem with freedom, dignity and equal aspirations for success offered to each individual. With imminent threats against language, belief, culture and traditions brought about by globalization and in view of defending ourselves from such we make choice not for their conservation or making them museum exhibits, but rather offer the society a way of proceeding on with durable historic development of national values in the most conducive – the liberal-democratic environment for them.

Hereby, we, the Young Republicans realize that young people were always leading force in Georgia toward democracy and freedom. The main achievements of Georgia's recent history such as receiving independence, moving to democracy and free market and Rose Revolution were implemented by the initiatives of Georgia youth – mostly by the students and young professionals. So, we consider that young people should continue to defend the notion of freedom and democracy in our homeland. We, the Young Republicans participate in each matter concerning the future of Georgia and our own future. Hereby, we promote other young people in Georgia to actively participate in day to day life of our homeland and society in order to ensure their own rights, freedom and prospectus future.

We offer to citizens of Georgia. . .

- Parliamentary system of government instead of current presidential system.
- True liberalization of business environment – Reduce the taxes and tariffs, abolishment of complicated procedures for entrepreneurs for starting and following their business.
- Transparent and fair privatization of state enterprises and land.
- Social policy that will guarantee each citizen of Georgia its fundamental rights.
- State limited by freedom instead of freedom limited by state – abolishment any 'guardianship' by the government officials protecting the interests of individuals "unprepared" to lead their own independent life. Guaranteed free media, freedom of speech and assembly.
- Independent judiciary branch – judges independent in their decisions and protected from any pressures as from the government as well as from any criminal or other groups.
- Safeguarding of minority rights – Democracy is not a guarantor for exclusive governance of majority, but rather a safeguard for the defeated minority to participate in the governance. Surrender by minority towards majority-taken-decision doesn't mean a denial by minority of either its own opinion or attempts for their further expression.

- Justice instead of political justice – each individual should be equally protected and equally responsible in terms of law. There should not be any citizens which benefit or damage because of their disposition to ruling party.
- Consistent European and Euro-Atlantic integration instead of only populist declarations on this issue.
- Withdrawal of Georgia from CIS instead of anti-Russian hysteria.
- Strict fulfillment of the assumed international obligations.
- Coordination and cooperation of Georgia, Azerbaijan and Armenia for stability, conflict resolution and strengthening the democracy in South Caucasian region.
- Reliable partnership instead of provincialism and infantilism in International relations – There should not be any offensive assessments and statements done by Georgian officials, which sounds odd for a country aspiring to the European integration.
- Use of peaceful negotiations and public diplomacy for conflict resolution.
- Replacement of Russian Peace Forces in Abkhazia and Tskhinvali region by international ones.
- Reduction the term of military service to 1 year.
- Abolishment of mandatory military service.
- Reforms of Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Prosecutor's Office, because they stay as soviet-type military monsters with their military forces instead of being usual public service agents.

Overview of the Young Republicans

In July 2, 2005 with the initiatives of the 150 young person and leaders of Republican Party of Georgia the Youth Movement of Republican Party of Georgia (Young Republicans) was founded. Founders elected the temporary Administrative Board and the chairman of the organization. Afterwards, on the Meeting of General Assembly in May 9, 2006 current Administrative Boards and chairman were elected by delegates.

Except of organizational structure, described in statute of the Young republicans, there are different working groups, which include members with the same professional interests. They are supervised by the Central Apparatus of Young republicans. Members of this groups work as independently as well as together with members of the Republican Party of Georgia on conducting researches and preparing the policy paper about different issues. The working groups serve as one of the leverages of recruitment of mother party.

The working groups are created in the following issues:

- Law and human rights
- Economics and state budget
- International relations
- Culture, sport and youth
- Elections
- Environment and natural resources

Hereby, the central Apparatus consists of several secretaries which ensure day to day functioning of the YR, such as:

- Administrative Secretary
- Secretary of Public Relations
- Secretary of Regional and Local Branches
- Secretary of Human Resources
- Archive

Financial Sources

Financial sources of the YR include resources allocated by mother party and individual donations. At present it is not adopted membership fee. Overall budget of 2005 (July - December) was 2500 GEL. As for 2006, the current budget is 8500 GEL. Only 15% of this money is covered by individual donations, other part is covered by the mother party.

Events

As for campaigning and other events, it should be stressed that despite of short period of time since its foundation, the YR already conducted campaigning, demonstrations and events independently, as well as participated in events organized by the mother party and different NGO-s. These events aimed the popularization and extension of public awareness to the YR and its principles, stimulation of youth to actively participate in public life and fight against unfairness and violence in Georgia.

The most important events organized or co-organized by the YR are the following:

- Charitable exhibition for support of young artists (January 2006).
- Demonstration in front of the building of Russian embassy in Georgia with demands of withdrawal of Russian peace forces from Georgia and peaceful resolution of conflicts. Afterwards, poster campaigning with slogan – peaceful goodbye to Russian Peace Forces (February 2006).
- Sport contest and poster campaigning “The Young republicans for Fair Play and Equality” (June 2006).
- Charitable action for the international day of children. The members of the YR collected clothe and food for children and gave them to one of the poorest children’s shelter in Georgia (June 2006).
- Permanent actions: “for better Tbilisi” – members of the YR and other young people were cleaning the parks and gardens in capital of Georgia. Afterwards, the demonstration was held in front of Tbilisi city council with demands to resolve Tbilisi’s environmental problems (spring of 2006, demonstration – July 5, 2006. The international day of protection of environment).

- The permanent actions against the unfairness and violence. These actions were one of the most important political event of Georgia in 2006. They started after killing 29 years old citizen of Georgia by the order of high ranked officials of Ministry of Interior Affairs. This officials just did not like the manner of his behavior in bar. Representatives of opposition political parties, NGO-s and just ordinary citizens of Georgia participated in these actions, which included demonstrations in front of building of Parliament, State Chancellery and the Ministry of Interior Affairs, poster campaigning with slogan “there is a murderer in the city” and etc. Unfortunately, the real murderers were not punished. Moreover, killings like this have happened again, so these actions are still continued (started at the end of 2005).
- Campaigning of the mother party for the local elections (September 2006).

The Young republicans for Fair Play and Equality

Sport contest and poster campaigning “The Young republicans for Fair Play and Equality” was one of the most successful independent campaigning of the YR. It is evident, ethnical and social inequality as well as nepotism and nonexistence of equal rights and initial opportunities is the most important problem of contemporary youth of Georgia. This campaigning was dedicated to demonstrate the willingness of the YR to fight with above-mentioned issue, therefore, to stimulate the youth to promote the ideas of equality and free and fair competition. It was organized by the Surami local organization as well as central office of the YR.

The campaigning took place in July 14 2006 in Surami, were the football contest was open for the YR’s cup. Participants included 8 teams from local schools. Contest lasted for three days. The winner was the football team from the Surami II school. This team received the Cup of Young republicans. Other participants received certificates and different presents.

After this the posters with the pictures of the contest and slogan – “The Young republicans for Fair Play and Equality” was located as in capital as well as in different parts of Georgia. This campaigning increased the number of Surami local organization

with 22% and enhanced the reputation of the YR as well as promoted the discussions among youth about main issues of campaigning. In next future, the YR plans to continue the same campaigning and organize the bigger contest in Tbilisi.

General Plane of Youth Republicans' Development for 2007

The basic goal for 2007 Young Republicans is to popularize the liberal ideology and policy among young people in Georgia and gain their political support. This support should be reflected in extension of members' quantity of the YR and activation of current members.

The Young Republicans have defined the following objectives in order to reach their goals.

- n Extension of the branches outside the capital. Foundation and development of regional and local organizations of the YR.*
 - To cover the 70% of Georgia with local organizations.
 - To found of regional organizations in 50% of Georgia regions.
 - To found initiative groups in areas where it will be impossible to create regional and local organizations.
 - Training for trainers – training of groups of leaders in regional and local levels in central organization, who will train youth in their area afterwards.

- n Consolidation of central organization and keep trends of its extension*
 - To increase the professionalism and qualification of current active members by their participation in different national and international seminars and trainings.
 - To find additional sources of funding.
 - To gain support of the most active part of the youth in capital – students.

- n To maintain current international contacts and to develop them*

- To develop contacts with IFLRY and LYMEC member organizations and cooperate with them in order to transfer their experience in Georgia and the YR.
- To submit the application for candidate membership in LYMEC.

Specific action plans for fulfillment of each objective will be presented to the administrative Board in November 17, 2006. The administrative Board will confirm final action plan prior to December 24, 2006.
